He earned an MBA from Campbell University at Buies Creeks, North Carolina; and received his degree with honors from the ABA Stonier Graduate School of Banking at the University of Delaware in 1998. He graduated from UNC-Chapel Hill in the Advanced Management Program in 1999.

Mr. Lobo's 33 year career has involved most facets of commercial, retail, mortgage and international banking. He is past Chairman of the Board of Advisors of the American Bankers Association Stonier Graduate School of Banking 2011-2013. Nationally he serves as member of the ABA Foundation, member of the Senior Executive Corporate Advisory Council of the United States Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and member the NOVANT Hospital Board of Trustees.

Mr. Lobo lectures extensively at colleges, universities and financial industry forums across the U.S. on "Change Management," "Leadership," and "Sales Culture." Mr. Lobo served 10 years on the faculty of the BB&T Banking School at Wake Forest University and is on the faculty of ABA Stonier Graduate School of Banking at University of Pennsylvania.
